Description:

The Environmental Action Coalition is a non-profit citizens' association in New York City dedicated to expanding public awareness of environmental problems. It works to achieve this goal through consumer re-education, the development of an environmental education curriculum for schools, and the coordination of environmental protection and improvement projects with community groups, businesses, government, and the scientific community. Organized in 1970 as the New York Committee for Earth Day, the EAC presently has a staff of five and a membership of 1500. It focuses on the issues of recycling and solid waste disposal (including hazardous and toxic waste), urban forestry, water conservation, and environmental education. Among its activities the EAC produces educational materials for schools, provides speakers on environmental topics, holds teacher training workshops, and publishes Eco-News, the first environmental newsletter for children. publishes newsletters and leaflets for adults, maintains an environmental library of printed and audio-visual materials, organizes recycling centers and collections, sponsors the Youth Conservation Corps in city parks, monitors the city's waste disposal processes, and advises state and local government on environmental The EAC has also sponsored several conferences, including "Defusing the Garbage Time-Bomb" (1978-79) and "Getting a Handle on the Bottle Bill" (1983).

The collection contains the records of the EAC from 1970 to 1979 with scattered materials from 1980 to the present. are divided into background information and publications, general records, and environmental education records. Box 1 contains background information on the EAC, statements of its goals and objectives, publicity fliers, and copies of EAC publications, including the newsletters Cycle and Eco-News. The general records consist of topical files arranged alphabetically. Included are Board of Directors meeting minutes, correspondence, and memoranda (1971-79), proposals with related correspondence and reports (1972-1979), and annual and status reports on EAC programs (1972-73). Among the grant proposals are extensive materials, including photographs, on the EAC and National Science Foundation sponsored conference series, "Defusing the Garbage Time-Bomb". The file "Personnel" contains staff correspondence and activity reports, including the correspondence of the executive director for 1977. The solid waste program records (1971-83) contain correspondence of the solid waste director, reference files on solid waste problems, reports on specific recycling and waste programs, and EAC testimony on these issues. The environmental education records contain correspondence (1971-80) of the public information and environmental education staff, records of speaking engagements at schools, questionnaires on use of the EAC library, printed educational materials on various topics (particularly street trees and urban forestry), and correspondence, clippings, promotional materials, and general business files (mailing lists, subscriptions, financial records) regarding the production of Eco-News. Finally, the collection contains notes and drafts of a 1978 study on Prospect Park, Brooklyn, printed material regarding the celebration of Sun Day, 1978, and EAC posters.

Description This addition to the records of the Environmental Action Coalition doubles the size of the collection. The bulk of the new material documents the period 1977-1983. Since the two accessions overlap in both time period and content, they should be used together.
New material of particular note include chronological correspondence files, 1977-1983, containing predominantly outgoing letters of the Solid Waste Management Program Director, 1977-78 and the Executive Director, 1980-83; additional material on environmental education programs, particularly workshops on urban forestry; one linear foot of files relating to the administration of the National Science Foundation grant for the "Defusing the Garbage Time Bomb" conferences, 1977-78; extensive files on container laws, 1971-83, most notably the New York State "Bottle Bill; and a small amount of material on Earth Day, 1970, the EAC's first initiative. Description

These additions to the records of the Environmental Action Coalition, 1970-1988, consist of Waste Management Program files 1980-1986, letters sent by Executive Director Nancy Wolf, 1986-87, and a small amount of material regarding the publication of Eco-News, 1977-86, tax and audit records, 1970-77, and miscellaneous and unsorted papers, 1984-1988 and undated.

The Waste Management Program files constitute the bulk of These files primarily document the EAC's these additions. participation in the establishment and implementation of recycling efforts in New York City. Included is correspondence of Program Directors James L. King, 1980-1983, and Ivan Braun, 1984-1985, and Recycling Coordinator Derrick Watson, 1982-1984. Significant among the files are a 1980 report on how to improve source separation in New York City, including surveys of recyling centers and market surveys of businesses which purchase or cart recycled material; volume reports from recycling centers, 1980-1983; 1984-85 Voluntary Recycling Centers planning grant files; and questionnaires completed during a 1986 survey of tenants of residential buildings participating the the Newspaper Recycling Program directed by the EAC under contract to the New York City Department of Sanitation. The papers contain correspondence, meeting minutes, reports and conference papers documenting the EAC relationships with the New York City and State governments, schools, community groups, and environmental activist organizations. Included are the NYC Department of Sanitation, NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, NYS Environmental Roundtable, NYS Legislative Committee on Solid Waste, East Harlem Council for Community Improvement, and the Fieldston School. In addition to recycling, there are files on hazardous and toxic waste (including the joint project of the EAC and the NYC School of Applied Sciences to produce a toxic and hazardous waste directory), the NYS Returnable Container Law, and the proposal for a resource recovery plant at the Brooklyn Navy Yard.

The papers also include a few files on resource recovery topics, 1971-77, some loose unsorted papers, 1984-88, and files of printed and near print material pertaining to a variety of environmental issues.

Scope and content note

The 1996 and 2001 additions to the Environmental Action Coalition records consist of office files, arranged alphabetically, spanning 1971-2001. There are extensive records and reports concerning the Apartment House Recycling Program and the Institutional Recycling Program, two of the earliest efforts at establishing organized recycling in New York City. In addition to general files on those programs, the collection includes records of participating buildings and organizations. Other files detail programs for plastic recycling and for the Land-Based Sludge Management Plan.

There are records of EAC fundraising events, as well as corporate sponsorships. Other organizational details are recorded in minutes of EAC board meetings, which are also contained in the records. The files include published versions and drafts of various editions of *Eco News*, as well as other EAC publications. The additions also contain alphabetized subject files, files from the office of Timothy Forker, Director of Outreach, and a small number of unsorted files. A set of alphabetical files of organizations is only partially complete, covering the latter half of the alphabet.
