Abstract: Naomi Ornest (d. 2007) was an opera singer active in the late 1940s and early 1950s. She was later an opera director and translator. Her husband, William Yokel, a writer, worked for the American Theatre Wing (ATW). The Naomi Ornest and William Yokel papers date from 1945 to 1989 and document the career of Naomi Ornest through scores and correspondence. They also detail William Yokel's production for the American Theatre Wing of the WNYC radio program, Music on the Wing, through correspondence and scripts.

Creator History

Naomi Ornest (d. 2007) was an opera singer active in the late 1940s and early 1950s. She was later an opera director and translator. Her husband, William Yokel, a writer, worked for the American Theatre Wing (ATW), and produced the ATW's radio program Music on the Wing (broadcast on WNYC), which featured various types of music performed by artists associated with the ATW.

Scope and Content Note

The Naomi Ornest and William Yokel papers date from 1945 to 1989 and document the vocal and opera directing careers of Naomi Ornest. They also detail William Yokel's production for the American Theatre Wing of the WNYC radio program Music on the Wing, and hold Yokel's writings.

Ornest's papers consist of scores for individual songs; correspondence; lists of opera engagements and roles performed; and the libretto or score for two operas. The scores are for piano and voice, and include both manuscript copies and a few manuscripts. Composers and librettists include William Flanagan, Frederick Piket, Richard Bodtke, Arthur F. Higgins, Russell Smith, Charles Strouse, Fritz Hutter, and Joseph Marx. The two operas are Trilby (1962), by Piket and Bodtke (directed by Ornest for the Opera Workshop of New York in 1967); and Discovery (1949), an early work by Strouse, based on a play by Charles Boultenhouse and John Myers. Ornest's correspondence is from William Flanagan (including postcards dating from 1989), William Yokel, friends, and family.

The William Yokel papers contain correspondence regarding Yokel's work on the WNYC program Music on the Wing, and a set of the program's scripts dating from 1948 to 1950. They also feature Yokel's essays and other writings dating from during and shortly after World War II.

Arrangement: The papers are in two sections: Naomi Ornest and William Yokel.
