SAGE (originally Senior Action in a Gay Environment, later Services and Advocacy for LGBT Elders) was founded in 1978 in New York City to provide social support to New York City's LGBT elders. The SAGE Center in Harlem was established in 2004.

The SAGE Harlem Legend in My Living Room Oral History Project was created by Souleo Wright and Steven G. Fullwood to capture the experiences of African American bisexual, gay, lesbian, and transgender people (LGBT) between the ages of 52 to 82.
