Abstract: This collections consists of promotional literature for films with African American casts. Many of the films are from Norman Studios, which produced silent films featuring African American casts from 1919 to 1928. The rest of the films are mostly Hollywood productions, the majority of which are from the 1930s-1940s. The promotional material includes leaflets, advertisements, window cards, and other accessories for movie theaters. In addition, there are handbills for boxers Henry Armstrong and Joe Louis.

Norman Pictures ca. 1919-1928

One of the most prominent studios creating films for Black audiences in the silent era, Norman's films featured all-Black casts with protagonists in positive roles.

b. 1 Black Gold

With all-Black cast featuring Lawrence Criner, Kathryn Boyd, Steve Reynolds, and Alfred Norcom

Includes two leaflets and large folio advertising accessories for movie theatres.

b. 1 The Crimson Skull

Co-starring Anita Bush and Lawrence Chenault with an all-Black cast supported by Bill Pickett. Includes one leaflet; 11 x 17" two-fold advertising window cards and other accessories for movie theaters; information about Anita Bush; and an article, "Introduction of Negro Drama in New York".

b. 1 The Flying Ace 1926

Silent film with Kathryn Boyd, Lawrence Criner, and an all-Black cast. Includes two leaflets and 11 x 17" two-fold advertising window cards.

b. 1 The Green-Eyed Monster

Includes all-Black cast.

Includes one leaflet.

b. 1 Regeneration

Romance featuring Stella Mayo with all-Black cast.

Includes one leaflet and one large folio.

b. 1 Folio featuring four films

Includes two-page, 9 x 12" folio advertising *The Love Bug*, Green-Eyed Monster, The Crimson Skull, and The Bull-Dogger (with Bill Pickett).

Hollywood films 1935-1974

This series includes promotional material for films from Hollywood studios, such as Paramount Pictures, Toddy Pictures, and Herald Pictures. The films include all-Black casts or feature Black actors in leading roles.

b. 1 "Amos 'n' Andy: Check and Double Check" ca. 1940s

RKO Radio Picture Super Production.

b. 1 Boy! What a Girl! 1947

From Herald Pictures, with Tim Moore, Elwood Smith, and Duke Williams.

b. 1 The Bronze Venus 1938

Also known as *The Duke Is Tops*; with with Lena Horne, Ralph Cooper, Laurence Criner. From Toddy Pictures.

b. 1 Hell's Alley 1931

With all-Black cast including Alvin Childress, Fay Miller, and Thomas Moseley; from Brown America Studio's Inc.

Includes one advertising folio and a plot summary.

b. 1 Lost in the Stars 1974

Starring Brock Peters, Raymond St. Jacques, Melba Moore, and Clifton Davis.

Includes press kit consisting of cast list and descriptions, synopsis, background notes, and biographical sketches of principal actors.

Hollywood films (cont.)

b. 1 Professor Creeps 1942

With Mantan Moreland; from Toddy Pictures.

b. 1 Sanders of the River 1935

Starring Paul Robeson and Nina Mae McKinney; produced by Alexander Korda and directed by Zoltan Korda.

b. 1 Together Brothers 1974

A Sanford Howard Production from 20th Century-Fox; with Ahmad Nurradin, Anthony Wilson, and Nelson Sims.

Includes press kit.

b. 1 The Virginia Judge 1935

With Stepin Fetchit; from Paramount Pictures.

Other ca. 1930s

This series includes promotional material, mostly handbills, for Henry Armstrong and Joe Louis boxing matches.

b. 1 Henry Armstrong promotional handbill

b. 1 Joe Louis handbills ca. 1935-1939

Includes ten handbills promoting fights on film between Louis and Primo Carnera, Tommy Farr, Jim Braddock, King Levinsky, Tony Galento, Bob Pastor, and ARturo Godoy. Also includes a promo for *Roar of the Crowd*.
