There is a handwritten account taken from the first issue of the first minutes of Gethsemane Baptist Church held at the Gethsemane Baptist Church in Chester, South Carolina in 1867. In addition, the collection includes a program from the Women's Baptist Missionary and Education Convention which met in 1921, and an appeal for funds from White for Friendship N.&I. College in Rock Hill, S.C. Also included are a poem written by White, a card with his photograph, and a copy of an open letter from Carter G.
