Creator History

The National Association of University Women (NAUW), founded in 1923, is comprised of women college and university graduates and has the following as its goals: to promote constructive work in education, civic activities, and human relations; to study educational conditions with emphasis on problems affecting women; and to encourage high educational standards and stimulate intellectual attainment and women generally. The NAUW maintains a placement service, awards program, and annual national fellowships; each local group gives one or more college scholarships annually.

The Queens Branch was organized in 1953 and engages in many fundraising activities to provide scholarships to women. The Queens Branch has assisted the Wayside Home for Girls on Long Island and a local youth group.
