Creator History

Juris Jurjevics (1943-2018) was a writer, editor, and founder of independent publisher Soho Press. During his editorial career, Jurjevics worked at Harper & Row, Avon Books, E.P. Dutton, and Dial Press, which published many titles by James Baldwin, including *Go Tell It on the Mountain* (1953), *The Fire Next Time* (1963), and *If Beale Street Could Talk* (1974). While editor-in-chief at Dial, Jurjevics edited James Baldwin's final novel, *Just Above My Head* (1979).
