Abstract: This collection contains the records of HB Playwrights Foundation and the personal and professional papers of its founders, actors Herbert Berghof and Uta Hagen. The Foundation was formed in New York City in 1964 to allow a space for playwrights, actors, directors, and designers to develop their plays in an experimental environment free from commercial limitations. Material relating to the HB Playwrights Foundation includes extensive production material and a small amount of administrative files. Files relating to Berghof and Hagen consist of correspondence, appointment books, diaries, photographs and photo albums, production files, scrapbooks, and a small amount of personal material.

Access: Collection is open to the public. Library policy on photocopying will apply. Advance notice may be required. Inquiries regarding audio and video materials in the series may be directed to the Billy Rose Theatre Division (theatrediv@nypl.org). Audio/visual materials may be subject to preservation evaluation and migration prior to access.

Creator history

HB Playwrights Foundation

The HB Playwrights Foundation was founded in 1964 by actors Herbert Berghof and Uta Hagen in New York City . The Foundation is a sister organization to HB Studio, a school that offers training to actors and other theater artists and was founded by Berghof in 1945. HB Studio had been staging productions since its inception as a forum to develop and showcase new talent. Founding HB Playwrights Foundation as a separate organization highlighted the importance of these productions and allowed the Foundation to have its own administration and operating budget.

The Foundation, along with HB Studio, is housed in a three building complex in the West Village and has a theater that can seat eighty people. Berghof and Hagen formed the Foundation to give playwrights, actors, and technical staff the opportunity to hone their skills in an environment that encouraged experimentation and was free from commercial pressures. To this effect, Berghof and Hagen did not invite critics to the performances, kept the performances free for audience members, and gave no payment to playwrights, actors, and technical staff. The Actors' Equity Association, recognizing the educational nature of the performances, granted the Foundation a special agreement recognizing that all work was pro bono and allowing longer than usual rehearsal periods. Works were selected by an application process and playwrights were afforded an intensive workshop with a director, full cast, and an invited audience for either a full production or a staged reading. While the Foundation was dedicated to promoted new playwrights and works, it would occasionally stage adaptations of more classic works. In addition to productions and readings, the Foundation hosted an annual Christmas play, The Second Shepherd's Play, from 1967-1989, and produced a number of special evening events including lectures from well-known experts and musical performances.

HB Playwrights Foundation is still an active organization at the time of this writing (2011) and upholds the beliefs and structures set in place by its founders. Playwrights who have worked with the Foundation include Neena Beber, Saul Bellow, Eric Bentley, Bertolt Brecht, Vincent Canby, Laura Shaine Cunningham, Donna de Matteo, Horton Foote, Marjorie Kellogg, Pavel Kohout, Romulus Linney, Kenneth Lonergan, Mark Medoff, Ed Napier, James Purdy, James Ryan, Willam Saroyan, Martin Sherman, Michael Straight, William Styron, Kathleen Tolan, Thornton Wilder, Tennessee Williams, Sherman Yellen.

Uta Hagen and Herbert Berghof

Uta Thyra Hagen (1919-2004) was born in Germany to Oscar and Thyra Hagen. Her father had begun the Handel Opera Festival in Göttingen and her mother was a Danish opera singer and teacher. When Hagen was six, the family moved to Madison, Wisconsin where her father founded the Department of Art History at the University of Wisconsin. Hagen was attracted to acting at an early age and trained briefly at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts in London in 1936. She made her Broadway debut as Nina in The Sea Gull (1938). That same year, she married actor Jose Ferrer and starred with Ferrer and Paul Robeson in the well-known production of Othello. Hagen and Ferrer had one daughter in 1940 named Leticia ("Letty"). Hagen met and married Berghof in 1947 when they were both in the Broadway

production of The Whole World Over. Hagen went on to originate the role of Georgie Elgin in Clifford Odets' The Country Girl (1950), winning her first Tony Award in 1951. Hagen performed the title role in Saint Joan (1951), as well as starred in Tovarich (1952), In Any Language (1952), The Magic and the Loss (1954), and Island of Goats (1955).

In the early 1950's Hagen's liberal political views and activities caused her to be blacklisted from television and Broadway and subpoenaed by the House Un-American Activities Committee. In 1962, Hagen made her return to Broadway starring in the acclaimed Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?, earning her a second Tony Award in 1963. Her subsequent Broadway appearances included The Cherry Orchard (1968), You Never Can Tell (1986), Mrs. Klein (1995), Collected Stories (1998), and Six Dance Lessons in Six Weeks (2001). Hagen also appeared in the film The Boys from Brazil (1978), for which she was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Supporting Actress, and in Reversal of Fortune (1990). Her television appearances included the soap opera One Life to Live (1986) and television movie Seasonal Differences (1987); she received Daytime Emmy Award nominations for both.

Hagen continued to teach and her master classes became the basis for her two classic acting texts, Respect for Acting (1973), co-written Haskel Frankel, and A Challenge for the Actor (1991). Uta Hagen's Acting Class (2001) video captured Uta's classroom teaching on film. Also a gourmet cook, Hagen wrote a cookbook Love for Cooking (1976).

Herbert Berghof (1909-1990) was a born in Vienna to Paul and Regina (Sternberg) Berghof. His father was a railroad stationmaster. Berghof attended the University of Vienna and the Vienna State Academy of Dramatic Art and studied with Alexander Moissi, Max Reinhardt, and Lee Strasberg. He spent twelve years honing his craft on the European stage before emigrating to the United States in 1938 to escape Nazi persecution. In the United States, Berghof found work as a teacher at Erwin Piscator's Dramatic Workshop at the New School for Social Research and at the Neighborhood Playhouse. Berghof first garnered acclaim in the United States in an adaptation of Nathan the Wise (1942), then appearing on Broadway in The Innocent Voyage (1943), The Man Who Had All the Luck (1944), Hedda Gabler (1948), Miss Liberty (1949), The Deep Blue Sea (1952), The Andersonville Trial (1959), and In the Matter of J. Robert Oppenheimer (1969). He appeared in summer stock productions such as Design for Living (1943) and The Guardsman (1951). Berghof was also well known for directing the first American staging of Waiting for Godot (1956).

In addition to their individual stage careers, the couple adapted, produced, and performed together works such as Cyprienne (1955), The Daily Life (1955), and The Queen and the Rebels (1959). They also toured with productions of The Play's the Thing (1952), The Lady's Not for Burning (1953), The Affairs of Anatol (1957), and Charlotte (1980), a play that was translated by Berghof and Hagen, produced and directed by Berghof, and starred Hagen. Berghof and Hagen lived in Greenwich Village and had a summer home in Montauk, Long Island.

Scope and content note

This collection contains the records of the HB Playwrights Foundation and the personal and professional papers of its founders, Herbert Berghof and Uta Hagen. Records relating to the Foundation are primarily production files, but also includes a small amount of administrative files. Material relating to Hagen and Berghof consists of correspondence, appointment books, diaries, photographs and photo albums, production files, scrapbooks, and a small amount of personal material. Production files include scripts, photographs, posters, prompt books, and published works. Sound and video recordings are primarily recordings of productions, but also have music used during performances, sound cues, and recordings of Hagen teaching. Playwrights represented in the records include Donna de Matteo, Horton Foote, Peter Hacks, Peter Handke, Pavel Kohout, Romulus Linney, and William Packard, among others.

This collection contains material similar to that found in the Uta Hagen and Herbert Berghof papers, 1889-2004, and in the HB Studio records, 1939-2009, both held in the Billy Rose Theatre Division at this library. This series is arranged into two subseries: I. A. General and I. B. Productions and Staged Readings. For additional material relating to the HB Playwrights Foundation, see the Uta Hagen and Herbert Berghof papers, 1889-2004.

I. A. General, 1959-1988

The subseries is arranged in alphabetical order and contains administrative files, photographs, and programs. The administrative files are fragmentary and do not offer a comprehensive view of the day-to-day operations of the Foundation. The general folder includes house reports and contact lists. Correspondence primarily concerns production rights and other logistical matters pertaining to the production of plays. There are occasional letters from people inquiring regarding employment at HB Studios and at the Foundation and a small amount of Berghof and Hagen's personal correspondence. Announcements and programs include posters advertising master classes taught by Marianne Fearn, Horton Foote, and Anthony Hopkins, lectures from the People Who Make Theatre lecture series, and programs of productions, workshops, and benefit shows. Marlene Mancini taught at HB Studio and was a long-time assistant to Berghof. Her file contains material related to her acting classes for children. The file on fundraising holds Matthew Broderick's script of Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?. This was read at Hagen's 80th birthday celebration which doubled as a Foundation benefit.

I. B. Productions and Staged Readings, 1940-1990

This subseries is arranged alphabetically by production and represents theatrical productions and staged readings produced by the foundation. Files such as correspondence, costume and set designs, photographs, posters, promotional material, prompt books, research materials, scripts, and theatrical notes are held here. The prompt books are particularly rich and can contain cast lists, news clippings, notes, set and lighting designs, schedules, and annotated scripts. Often productions contain multiple scripts. These scripts can include various revisions, scripts with notes for various characters and technical staff, master scripts, and tour scripts. Posters represent the majority of productions produced by the Foundation and include mock-ups, negatives, and finished posters.

In addition to producing plays, the Foundation staged reviews of a selection of scenes from various plays, such as K on K (Kafka on Kafka) that was composed of scenes from many of Kafka's seminal works and The Scene Project that included scenes from Seymour is Dead, Happiest Day, Light in August, Progress Report, Sun Set, Sue Drinkwater, and Sad Song. The HB Retrospective, produced in 1992, showcased portions of Waiting for Godot, Charlotte, In a Coffin in Egypt, and A Report to the Academy. The Foundation also hosted evenings of one-act plays and musical performances. Romulus Linney's One and Two Act Plays included Holy Ghosts, The Broofer, Who is Buried in Grant's Tomb, Goodbye Howard, Democracy and Ester, Man's Estate, The Love Suicide, and Don't Worry About Me. Three Pieces of Peter Hanke consisted of Public Insult,Self-Accusation, and Description of a Life. Tales of Manhattan included The Landmarker, The Country Cousin, and The Club Bedroom. The Poetry of Norman Rosten regards a recording made of Rosten, Hagen, and actor Robert Elston reading Rosten's poetry.

II. D. Productions and Professional Projects, 1916-1988

This subseries is arranged alphabetically by production. These files pertain to Berghof and Hagen's work in theater and in television productions. Files consist of correspondence, costume and set design, legal agreements, playbills, promotional material, prompt books, scripts, and theatrical notes. The prompt books can contain cast lists, news clippings, notes, photographs, set and lighting designs, schedules, and annotated scripts. Often productions contain multiple scripts. These scripts can include various revisions, scripts with notes for various characters and technical staff, master scripts, and tour scripts.

The material regarding Charlotte is particularly extensive and covers pre-and-post production, Charlotte's Broadway debut, and subsequent international tour. The general file consists of copyright registration for Hagen and Berghof's translation, rehearsal and performance calendars, and biographical information and photographs of playwright Peter Hacks. Correspondence is primarily from Berghof and his assistant at the time, Marlene Mancini, and discusses financial and production matters, including correspondence with Hacks. Contracts are with actors and production staff through the Actors' Equity Association, with investors, and with Hacks. Financial materials contain budgets, check enclosures, and account notebooks from the tour. Research materials contain articles, images used for potential costume and set design, and notes of Stein genealogy. Tour bookings hold correspondence, contracts, programs, and reviews for various performances in the United States and Canada. The files for Poor Murder have extensive notes on various interpretations and correspondence with Czech playwright Pavel Kohout, who at that time was viewed as a dissident for his signing of Charter 77, and actress Joan Davis. The casting problems file contains suggestions for roles, notes on agents, and audition schedules, demonstrating the process of casting for a production.

The set and costume designs, particularly for The Affairs of Anatol, Charlotte, and Tovarich are elaborate and hand-drawn. The Tovarich set designs have correspondence from Harry Horner to Hagen and Berghof. Posters include negatives, mock-ups, and finished products and are for special events, readings, and staged productions. Published texts have been heavily annotated by Berghof or Hagen. Many of the books demonstrate heavy use with missing covers or fragile binding. The copy of Faust, published by the Arden Book Company and illustrated by Harry Clarke, includes a German version, published in 1938, interleaved within the pages. Additionally, there are translation notes pasted throughout the book.
