Abstract: The Paper Bag Players is a company of adults who create and perform original, contemporary, musical theater for children. The records document the administrative activities of the Paper Bag Players, and to a lesser degree, their performances. Material includes production files; financial files; fan mail from children; collateral material and ephemera; scrapbooks; a small quantity of original artwork; and Audio and Video material.

Access: Collection is open to the public. Photocopying prohibited. Advance notice may be required.

Inquiries regarding audio and video materials in the collection may be directed to the Billy Rose Theatre Collection. Audio/visual materials may be subject to preservation evaluation and migration prior to access.

Processing note

Financial material has been largely weeded. Records relating to the organization will have been retained; records pertaining to individuals (employees, donors, etc.) have been removed due to privacy concerns. Clippings have been transferred to LPA, to be integrated into the pre-existing Paper Bag Players clippings files. Duplicates and deaccessioned material will be returned to LPA. Creator history

The Paper Bag Players is a company of adults who create and perform original, contemporary, musical theater for children. The Paper Bag Players was founded in 1958 by Judith Martin, Shirley Kaplin, Sudie Bond and Remy Charlip. All four shared creativity during the first years, but as the company developed, Judith Martin more and more shaped The Paper Bag Players identity. Martin remained in the role of artistic director for fifty years, and as a writer, designer, director and actress, she both established and embodied The Paper Bag Players style. In 1966, Donald Ashwander joined the company as composer and performer. Ted Brackett assumed the role of artistic director in 2009, after having worked closely with Judith Martin for 23 years.

The Paper Bag Players have toured in 37 states, as well as to Canada, England, Scotland, Wales, Israel, Iran, Egypt, the Philippines, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Japan. The first theater for children to perform at Lincoln Center and to receive a grant from the NEA, The Bags have been recognized with an OBIE, awards for excellence from the American Association for Theater and Education, American Theater Wing Awards, the New York State Artists Award, The Broadway Theater Institute Award for Theater and Education. The company is still active as of 2011.

Scope and content note

The records document the administrative activities of the Paper Bag Players, and to a lesser degree, their performances. Material includes production files, financial files, fan mail from children, collateral material and ephemera, scrapbooks, and a small quantity of original artwork. The documents are primarily focused on the period 1990-2004, with very little material documenting the earlier decades of their work. The collection also includes Audio and Video material, including recordings of Paper Bag Players scores, and film and videotape of productions and public appearances. This material is currently being processed and is not available for consultation.

Additional material relating to the Paper Bag Players is available in the clippings files of the Music Division, and in the photograph collection of the Billy Rose Theater Division. Prompt books and typescripts of some Paper Bag Players productions are also available in the Billy Rose Theater Division.

Series I: Administrative Files, 1987-2008

Administrative files consist of production files, financial and legal documents, and material relating to the death of PBP's long-time musical director, Donald Ashwander. Production files document Paper Bag Players productions and tours, including contracts with venues and vendors; licensing agreements; technical riders; tour and rehearsal schedules; and some correspondence. Material covers the years 1989-1992, and is arranged chronologically by season. No files for 1997 are present. Calendars record rehearsal and performance times, venues, house size, and other details pertinent to the scheduling of their shows. Financial files include bank reconciliation statements; donation logs; tax returns; quarterly reports; audits used to maintain the company's nonprofit status; and other accounting documents for the period 1997-2008. Files related to Donald Ashwander contain condolence correspondence sent to Judith Martin and others; programs and ephemera relating to memorial services; material relating to his music, including programs from performances outside of the Paper Bag Players, drafts of liner notes, and a copy of *The Piano Music of Donald Ashwander, Vol. II*, a songbook compiled and produced by his family after his death; and a small quantity of photographs. 9 boxes
