Biographical Note

James Gelb, Broadway stage manager, was born in 1906. He began his career as a member of Eva LeGallienne's Civic Repertory Company in the 1930s and later worked with the Group Theater. He worked on most of the plays directed by Harold Clurman and for producers and directors such as Kermit Bloomgarden, Elia Kazan, and Robert Whitehead. He died October 16, 1985.
