He created the music for such well-known songs as: "Over the Rainbow", "StormyWeather", "That Old Black Magic", and "Blues in the Night". Among his collaborators were: E.Y. Harburg, Johnny Mercer, Ira Gershwin, Dorothy Fields and Leo Robbin. DESCRIPTION: The papers of Harold Arlen consist solely of scripts and outlines for plays which were sent for his review. There is no material pertaining to

Harold Arlen himself.

### HAROLD ARLEN PAPERS INTRODUCTION

The Harold Arlen Papers were donated to The Billy Rose Theatre Collection in 1986 by his family. There is no further documentation on the collection, however, they were in good condition at the time of archival processing. Arrangement and description was completed in 1991.

### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE ON HAROLD ARLEN

Harold Arlen was born in Buffalo, New York on February 15, 1905. The son of a cantor, music was an important part of his early life. He sang in the synagogue and studied piano. In 1929 he wrote his first hit song, "Get Happy". Arlen's particular genius was for music in the blues genre. He wrote material for the Cotton Club in Harlem. Some of his best-known musical works are in the blues style: Stormy Weather, Blues In the Night and That Old Black Magic. He won an Academy Award for the song "Over the Rainbow" from the film THE WIZARD OF OZ. His film credits also include: RIO RITA, CABIN IN THE SKY, A STAR IS BORN and THE COUNTRY GIRL. His Broadway production credits include: BLOOMER GIRL, ST. LOUIS WOMAN, HOUSE OF FLOWERS and JAMAICA. Harold Arlen died on April 23, 1986 in New York City.

### SCOPE NOTE

The Harold Arlen papers consist of outlines sent him by agents and playwrights. Scripts included in the collection have been separated and added to the scripts file. The collection spans the years 1947 to 1967. There are no personal papers or papers relating to Harold Arlen's own career in the collection.
