BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT:

Jr., actor George Hazelton, and playwright, was born January 20, 1868. He performed as an actor with Lawrence Barrett, Edwin Booth, and Madame Modjeska. His first play was THE RAVEN about the life of Edgar Allan Poe. His next play, MISTRESS NELL, was written in 1900 and was a great success. His best known play was THE YELLOW JACKET, which he co-authored in 1912 with Benrimo. THE YELLOW JACKET was performed around the world by a number of notable actors including Mr. and Mrs. Charles Coburn and Harpo Marx. Hazelton died in New York June 24, 1921.

DESCRIPTION:

Correspondence, diaries, ledgers, promptbooks, scripts, photographs, clippings, scrapbooks, and programs, 1848-1941, documenting Hazelton's private and professional life. After his death, his wife, as executor, maintained the business correspondence and records until 1941. The collection provides voluminous and detailed research materials about theater and daily life in the late 1800s and early 1900s.

INTRODUCTION

The George Hazelton Papers were donated to the Billy Rose Theater Collection by his daughter Miss Byrd C. Hazelton in two shipments. The bulk of the collection arrived in March 1989 and the additional material was delivered March 1990. All of the papers were received in very good condition. Portions of the collection were separated and transferred to other divisions within the New York Public Library for the Performing Arts. Music received 50 scores. The Rodgers and Hammerstein Archives of Recorded Sound received six phonodiscs of a recording by N.B.C. of one of Hazelton's plays. The remaining portion of the processed collection, 19 linear feet, is housed in the Billy Rose Theatre Collection.

ARRANGEMENT NOTES

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

George Hazelton, Jr., playwright, actor, and lawyer, was born in Wisconsin January 20, 1868. He began his professional career as an actor when he was associated with some of the most prestigious acting companies and actors of the time. He was in Lawrence Barrett's company in March 1891 when Barrett finally took the stage, and he was performing in HAMLET that same year with Edwin Booth when Booth said his final farewell. Hazelton also performed for one season with Madame Modjeska's company.

Hazelton was also a lawyer and he left his brief acting career to practice law in both Philadelphia and New York City. He soon discovered, however, that he had a talent for writing. In 1897 he published The National Capitol, a guide to Washington, D.C. His first play was THE RAVEN about the life of Edgar Allan Poe, which starred Creston Clarke. His next play, MISTRESS NELL, written in 1900 was a tremendous success and raised actress Henrietta Crosman who played the role of Nell Gwynne to star status. Some of his later works include CAPTAIN MOLLY in 1902, THE WHIRLWIND in 1910, THE YELLOW JACKET in 1912, and APHRODITE in 1917. THE YELLOW JACKET was Hazelton's most popular and successful play. It was coauthored with Harry Benrimo, and was performed internationally. It was performed by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Coburn for many years, and continued to be popular after Hazelton's death. In 1941 Harpo Marx played the role of the property man.

Hazelton died in New York City June 24, 1921.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Hazelton papers consist of correspondence, diaries, ledgers, promptbooks, scripts, photographs, clippings, programs, and scrapbooks documenting his professional and private life. The collection even contains his handwritten notes summarizing important meetings. The material was received in very good order. The final arrangement of the papers is as close to the original organization as possible. The papers are a rich resource not only about his life, but about theater in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Hazelton was a conscientious correspondent and chronicler of his time—he wrote detailed letters and kept diaries about his daily activities, the theater, and politics. There is however, not much business correspondence from Hazelton and there are very few financial records. There is some family correspondence that predates Hazelton's birth, and his wife continued to handle correspondence related to his work after his death.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

SERIES I -- CORRESPONDENCE (1848-1939) 3.5 lin. ft.

This series is arranged chronologically (except for the undated correspondence which is arranged alphabetically by last name) and consists of personal and professional correspondence to and from George Hazelton up to his death in 1921. After his death, the correspondence is exclusively professional to and from his wife, Byrd Hazelton. The correspondence from Harpo Marx in Box 28,988 folder 8 has been xeroxed and placed in the CAGE file. Special permission from the curator is required to see the original letters.

SERIES II -- SCHOOL PAPERS (1886) 2.5 lin. in.

This series consists of Hazelton's school yearbook and essays he wrote for school. The dated yearbook is first, and then the undated essays are arranged alphabetically by title.

SERIES III -- DIARIES (1880-1920) .83 lin. ft.

The diaries are arranged chronologically. They contain detailed information about Hazelton's professional and private life, and provide insight into daily life in the late 1800s and early 1900s.

SERIES IV -- LEDGERS (1903-1916) 2.5 lin. in.

The two ledgers are arranged chronologically and provide some, but not extensive, information about Hazelton's finances, and information about a few of his plays.

SERIES V -- PROMPTBOOKS FROM HAZELTON'S ACTING CAREER (n.d.) 2.5 lin. in.

The two promptbooks are not dated and were for that reason arranged alphabetically. They are heavily annotated by Hazelton.

SERIES VI -- HAZELTON'S PRODUCTIONS (1900-1936) 6 lin. ft.

This series consists of scripts, outlines, scenarios, a film scenario, promptbooks, lyrics, correspondence and clippings related to plays written by Hazelton. The plays are arranged alphabetically by title. Hazelton made several carbon copies when writing, so for each play there are a number of identical typewritten scripts with different handwritten edits. For many of the plays there is also a vaudeville version. Wherever the title of a play was changed, there is a note in the folder listing. Of particular interest is a film scenario of MISTRESS NELL starring Mary Pickford (Box 29,001, Folder

6). There are also plays and written materials by writers other than Hazelton which he used as the basis for some of his plays.

SERIES VII -- CONTRACTS AND LEGAL PAPERS (1897-1920) 2.5 lin. in.

This series consists of theatrical and non-theatrical contracts and legal papers. The theatrical contracts are first and are organized chronologically. The non-theatrical contracts are primarily from Hazelton's legal practice and are also arranged chronologically.

SERIES VIII -- PROGRAMS AND PROMOTIONAL LITERATURE (1888-1941) 5 lin. in.

This series consists of programs and promotional literature from Hazelton's acting career and productions of his plays. The folder containing programs from his acting career begins the series, and productions of his plays follow in an alphabetical arrangement.

SERIES IX -- NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS AND MAGAZINE ARTICLES (1891-1942)
2.5 lin. in.

This series consists of articles about Hazelton's acting career and his plays. It is arranged chronologically.

SERIES X -- OTHER WRITINGS (1904-1920) 5 lin. in.

This series consists primarily of Hazelton's non-theatrical writings. Included in the series are notes, essays, poetry, short stories, speeches, a novel, and a screenplay. The series is arranged alphabetically.

SERIES XI -- PHOTOGRAPHS (1868-1935) 5 lin. in.

This series is arranged alphabetically by the subject's name with unidentified photographs and photographs of homes at the end.

SERIES XII--OVERSIZED MATERIALS (1890-1915) 3 lin. ft.

This series consists of programs from Hazelton's acting career posters, and poster sized photographs. The programs are arranged chronologically. The posters are arranged alphabetically by subject.

SERIES XIII--SCRAPBOOKS (1890-1941) 15 lin. ft.

This series consists of scrapbooks of clippings from Hazelton's acting career and productions, primarily MISTRESS NELL, CAPTAIN MOLLY, and THE YELLOW JACKET. There are also clippings from Edwin Booth's career. The series also contains galleys from the book "The Yellow Jacket," based on the play, and carbon copies of George Hazelton's correspondence. The correspondence is also being microfilmed because the pages are extremely fragile. The series is arranged chronologically.
