Abstract: The Constance D'Arcy MacKay Papers consist of correspondence, clippings, photographs, programs and writings pertaining to her career as a writer and director or pageants and plays. Included as well are articles written by her husband, Roland Holt. The collection spans the years 1912-1939.

Creator History

Constance D'Arcy MacKay was born in St. Paul, Minnesota, the daughter of Robert and Anne (D'Arcy) MacKay. She was educated at Boston University (1903-1904) and began her writing career in 1905. She is most famous as a writer of pageants and children's plays. Some of her works include: *The Pageant of Patriotism*(Prospect Park, Brooklyn, N.Y.: 1911) *The Historical Pageant of Schenectady, N.Y.* (Schenectady, N.Y.: 1912), *The Historical Pageant of Portland, Maine* (Portland, Me.: 1913), and *The Pageant of Sunshine and Shadows,* also known as *The Child Labor Pageant* (New York, N.Y. 1916). Her writings for children include: *The Silver Thread, The Magic Mirror,* and *The Boy Franklin.* She married publisher and writer Roland Holt in 1923.

Custodial History

The papers of Constance D'Arcy MacKay were discovered in 1992 in The Billy Rose Theatre Division as a result of a survey of the division's holdings. At that time the collection was reprocessed and a finding aid created. The materials were in good condition, though some conservation of newspaper items was required. The papers were most probably the gift of Nina Jeaane Nourse but the date of the acquisition and positive identification of the donor is not available.

Scope and Content Note

The Constance D'Arcy MacKay papers consist of correspondence, clippings, programs, and writings documenting the life and career of Ms. MacKay and her husband, Roland Holt. The papers span the years 1902-1955, though most of the materials range from 1910-1940.
