Biographical Note

William Appleton, collector, was born in New York on December 31, 1915. He graduated with a BA from Harvard University in 1938 and continued his education in New York City, receiving his Masters from Columbia University in 1939 and a Ph.D in 1949. He taught at Columbia from the 1940s until the late 1970s and was appointed Professor Emeritus in 1976.

William Appleton is a theater scholar. He has both written and edited works on theater, primarily English theater of the 18th and 19th centuries. His writings include *A Cycle of Cathay* (1951), *Beaumont and Fletcher: a Critical Study* (1956), *Charles Macklin : An Actor's Life* (1960) and *Madame Vestris and the London Stage* (1974). Works he has edited include *The Careless Husband* (1966), *The Prompter: a Theatrical Paper* (1734-1736) (1966) and *Letters to Dorothy* (1988).

Scope and Content Note

The William Appleton collection consists of letters, handwritten manuscripts, penny plains and two-pence coloured toy theater materials. The collection encompasses the late 17th century up through the 20th century. The oldest item in the collection is a letter from the actress, Elizabeth Barry to a Lady Lisbourn dated October 25, 1697. The latest item is a letter from the playwright, George Bernard Shaw to a J. T. Grein dated November 28, 1930. The bulk of the letters fall between the mid-18th century to the mid-19th century.

The collection contains many interesting letters from theatrical personages, primarily of the English stage. Some notables include Ira Aldridge, Mrs. Ann Barry, Dion Boucicault, George Colman, T. P. Cooke, Edward Gordon Craig, Maria Foote, David Garrick, Joseph Grimaldi, Sir Henry Irving, Charles Kean, Edmund Kean, Ellen Kean, Charles Kemble, John Philip Kemble, Charles Macklin, William Charles Macready, Lord North, Sir Arthur Wing Pinero, Jane Pope, Bernard Shaw, Sarah Siddons, Dame Ellen Terry and Madame Vestris, among others.

Also included are black and white and color portraits, known as "penny plains" and "two-pence coloured" showing the actors and actresses of the day in their well-known roles. Most of these images date from the early to mid 1800s though there are some as early as 1799.

Organization

The collection is organized into two series and 2 sub-series. They are: Series I - Letters Series II - Portraits Sub-series 1 – Penny plain Sub-series 2 – Two-pence coloured

Series Descriptions

Series I : Letters 1697-1930 1.5 lf. (5 boxes)

This series contains letters and other manuscripts documenting the theater from the late 17th century to the mid 20th century. Included as well are transcriptions of all the letters and most of the other documents. Correspondents include Mrs. Abington, Ira Aldridge, John Astley, Dion Boucicault, David Garrick, members of the Kemble and Kean families, Charles Macklin, William Charles Macready, Lord North, Jane Pope, Henry and Sarah Siddons, Bernard Shaw, Dame Ellen Terry and Madame Vestris, among others. Included as well are other types of manuscripts including an epilogue, contracts, some biographical notes, regulations for the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, a commentary by William Farren, a ballad called Jack Harding as well as a copy of a Folger manuscript on the same topic, some ephemera belonging to Edmund Kean, notes and scenic directions by John Philip Kemble, notes by Charles Macklin on the trial for the "Macbeth" riots, a theater notice by Charles Reed and a Drury Lane tailor voucher.

Series II: Portraits 1799-1847 1 lf. (3 boxes)

This series consists of black and white and color theatrical sheets, known as penny plains and two-pence coloured, documenting the actors and plays of the early to mid 19th century. Some of the imprints on the toy theater sheets include the printers West, Hodgson, B. M. DeBurson, J. Fairburn, J. Redington and B. Pollock. Almost all of the images are portraits of actors in various roles, although there are a few sheets of production sets and prop pieces.

Sub-series 1 – Penny Plain 1799-1847 60 prints (1 box)

This sub-series contains black and white theatrical sheets of actors in a variety of roles. The name penny plain comes from the cost which was "a penny". These sheets were created for the toy theater trade which was popular during this time of home entertainment. The black and white sheets were intended to be hand colored at home, mounted on cardboard and used in a puppet theater type setting. Some of the actors' portraits in this series include T. P. Cooke in a variety of roles, Maria Foote, Edmund Kean, Charles, John and Fanny Kemble, William Macready, O. Smith and Madame Vestris, among others.

Sub-series 2 – Two-pence Coloured ca. 1799-1837 246 prints (2 boxes)

This sub-series contains color theatrical sheets of actors in a variety of roles. The name two-pence coloured comes from the cost which was "two-pence". As with the penny plain sheets, these were created for the toy theater trade and used for home entertainment. Actors' portraits included in this series are Madame Celeste, John Collins, T. P. Cooke, Mr. Cooper, William Creswick, Maria Foote, Catherine Maria Forde, Joseph Grimaldi, N. T. Hicks, Edmund Kean, Charles and Fanny Kemble, William C. Macready, O. Smith, Madame Vestris and Mr. Wallack. Of special note are the scenic sheets included in the folder of miscellaneous portraits.
