## **Creator History**

American stage, television and film actor, Richard Paul Kiley was best known for creating the Tony Award winning title role in *Man of La Mancha*in the original 1965 Broadway production. He was the first to sing and record the song, *The Impossible Dream*, and recreated the role in the London production, a Lincoln Center revival and a United States tour. Born in Chicago on March 31, 1922, Kiley began his career as a juvenile on radio and made his Broadway debut in *Misalliance*(1953) for which he won a Theatre World Award. His first musical role was in *Kismet*(1953) where he introduced the song *Stranger in Paradise*; his first Tony Award was for the musical *Redhead*(1959) with Gwen Verdon. Other musicals were Richard Rodgers' *No Strings*(1962) with Diahann Carroll for which Kiley received a Tony nomination for best actor, *I Had a Ball*(1964) and *Her First Roman*(1968).

Most of Kiley's work did not make use of his strong vocal talent and rich baritone, however. He starred

on Broadway in *Time Limit*(1956), *Advise and Consent*(1960), *The Incomparable Max*(1971), *Voices*(1972), *Absurd Person Singular*(1974), *The Heiress*(1976), and *All My Sons*(1987) for which he received a Tony nomination for best actor in a play. Kiley also won Emmy Awards and Golden Globes for his television work in *The Thorn Birds*, *A Year in the Life*and *Picket Fences*. His films included *The Blackboard Jungle*, *The Little Prince*, *Looking for Mr. Goodbar*and *Endless Love*.

Kiley also had an extensive career doing voiceover work as a narrator for various documentaries including National Geographic, Nova, Planet Earth, Mysteries of the Bible, etc. He also performed in many solo shows and benefit concerts. Richard Kiley was married to Mary Bell Wood with whom he had six children from 1948-1967 and to Patricia Ferrier from 1968 until his death. He died of bone marrow disease on March 5, 1999.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The collection is primarily marked scripts reflecting the work of Richard Kiley on stage and screen and as a narrator of documentaries. Also includes some production materials such as memos, correspondence, schedules, call sheets and cast lists as well as photos, programs, publicity and clippings. There is not much material illustrating his early career and there is very little personal material, but his busy career from the late 1960s to the late 1990s is well covered.

The bulk of the Richard Kiley Papers, this series is mostly marked scripts for productions in which Kiley appeared, often in a starring role. Also includes a small amount of correspondence, memos, schedules, cast lists, call sheets, publicity, programs, photos and clippings pertaining to the productions.

Arranged in three subseries: theatrical or live performances, film & television, and voiceovers. Within each subseries, the arrangement is chronological..
