Abstract

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Papers of a producer of over fifty Broadway plays and musicals, consisting of draft and mimeo scripts by Marc Connelly, Howard Lindsay, Clifford Odets, Paul Osborn, Robert E. Sherwood, John Van Druten, and others; programs and playbills; press books (available only on microfilm); and miscellaneous production materials including set designs by Jo Mielziner. Represented are Babes in Arms (1937), Command to Love (1927), The Gay Divorce (1932), I Married An Angel (1938), Letters to Lucerne (1941), The Little Show (1929), Morning's At Seven (1939), On Borrowed Time (1938), The Racket (1927), The Road to Rome (1927), and many other titles. Also included are miscellaneous business records and correspondence, as well as orchestrations by Frederick Loewe and Arthur Schwartz for several productions. Production stills for many productions are available in the WCFTR Theatre Title File. The entire collection is available on microfilm.

Biography

Dwight Deere Wiman was born in Moline, Illinois, on August 8, 1895. After his college education at Yale University, he pursued a business career until 1921 when he joined Frank Tuttle in forming the Film Guild (an organization that produced movies in Astoria, Long Island).

At its studios, the Film Guild made a series of pictures climaxed by <u>Peter Stuyvesant</u>, the first venture in what was to have been a cinematographic history of the United States, planned in cooperation with Yale University Press. Marketing difficulties arose, however, and the Film Guild was dissolved in 1924.

In 1925 Wiman produced his first Broadway show, <u>Seed of the Brute</u>, and remained a highly successful Broadway producer until his death at the age of 55. Perhaps his most distinctive imprint upon the American theatre was made in the field of musical comedy and revue, and his production of <u>The Little Show</u>, <u>The Second Little Show</u>, <u>The Third Little Show</u>, <u>Babes in Arms</u>, <u>On Your Toes</u>, <u>I Married an Angel</u>, <u>Higher and Higher</u>, <u>By Jupiter</u>, and the musical version of <u>Street Scene</u> are noteworthy examples.

Among his legitimate play successes were Robert E. Sherwood's outstanding anti-war play The Road to Rome which starred Jane Cowl in 1927, four of Paul Osborn's significant American dramas (The Vinegar Tree, On Borrowed Time, Morning's at Seven, and Oliver, Oliver), and a number of John Van Druten's early plays: After All, The Damask Cheek, The Distaff Side, Most of the Game, and Old Acquaintance. During the season of his death (1950-1951), Wiman produced the well-known success, The Country Girl, with Paul Kelly and Uta Hagen and the Olivia deHaviland Romeo and Juliet.

Arrangement

The collection consists of GENERAL FILES and PRODUCTION FILES.

A Reel List for the microfilmed collection follows the Container List for the manuscript papers.

Scope and Content

The Wiman Papers consist almost entirely of scripts, orchestrations, press books, and incidental material relating to stage productions. Only a 1922 contract for The Scarecrow (in which Wyman appeared in a bit part) relates to his film production company during the early 1920's. Because of the scarcity of correspondence and financial records there is little

information in the papers about the process of theatrical production, although there is good information about the work actually staged. There is no personal material in the collection concerning either Wiman or his many important theatrical collaborators.

Press books were microfilmed for preservation and destroyed in 1986. In 1994 the remainder of the collection (including production stills that had been separated to the WCFTR Theatrical Stills File, but not the portraits of individual performers that had been separated to the Name File) was also microfilmed.

The GENERAL FILES consist of miscellaneous correspondence concerning partnerships formed to underwrite productions (Diversified Theatre Corp., Ima, and Theatrical Projects, Inc.) and some legal matters dating from the 1940's.

The PRODUCTION FILES consist of documentation relating to individual productions dating from the mid 1920's until Wiman's death in 1951. The files are arranged alphabetically by title. Documentation on each production varies, ranging from scripts, press books, published sheet music, to playbills and programs. The scripts often include both typed manuscripts submitted by important playwrights such as Howard Lindsay, Clifford Odets, Paul Osborn, Robert E. Sherwood, and John Van Druten as well as final mimeographed versions. The mimeographed scripts frequently contain information on casting, properties, lighting, and even set design sketches. The annotations on the scripts are unattributed, although many appear to have been made by authors, directors, and stage managers. The collection also includes a few stage designs by Jo Mielziner and original orchestrations for shows composed by Arthur Schwartz and Frederick Loewe, as well as scores (some extensively annotated) for individual instruments.

Publicity photographs received with the papers have been removed to the WCFTR Title Files. (Productions from which photographs were removed are indicated in the Container List with an asterisk.) In microfilming this section of the collection captioning information has been filmed (if it appears) after the image to which it refers.

The large number of press books received with the papers were microfilmed in 1986 after which the originals were destroyed.
