Biographical note

Ballet, theater and opera designer, and artist Leon Bakst (1866-1924) was born in Grodno, Russia and studied art in St. Petersburg and in Paris. Some of Bakst's best-known works were for Serge Diaghilev's Ballets Russes; another of his notable collaborators was the choreographer and dancer Ida Rubinstein. He died at his home in Paris.

Scope and content note

The Leon Bakst Designs consist of 11 designs for stage productions of *Phaedre* (1923), *Aladin* (undated) and some unidentified (possibly for *Helen de Sparte* (1919) productions.
