Creator History

Charlotte Walker (1876-1958) was a stage and film actress. She began her career with Richard Mansfield's company.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains photographs, a script, two clippings, and two letters documenting the career of actress Charlotte Walker. The papers span ca. 1900 to 1942. Photographs include Walker in some early stage roles, including *The Crisis* (1902), unidentified film stills, and portraits. There is also a photograph of a beloved maid, Lizzie, actress Beatrice Cameron (Mrs. Richard Mansfield), and an unidentified man in uniform.

Also included is a script for a play, *Made Land* (1935), with some notes. Clippings include an undated piece on Walker's daughter, actress Sara Haden, and one on the Wallack's Theatre production of *The Embarrassment of Riches* (1906), in which Walker appeared. A letter from Langdon Mitchell (undated) and one from Actors' Equity Association (June 2, 1942) are also in the collection.
