Abstract: Edward Albee (1928-2016) was an American, Pulitzer Prize winning playwright known for such works as *The Sandbox* (1959), and *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* (1962). This collection contains an annotated printer's setting typescript and three copy-edited galleys for his two-act play *The Man Who Had Three Arms*, which was published by Athenaeum in 1985.
